At around 6.10 pm the developers will have about 20 minutes to present their proposals. After the presentations there will be at least one hour for questions and answers.

What is a Development Forum?

It is a meeting which allows developers to present their development proposals and gather feedback from local residents, businesses and consultees before submitting their planning application. For residents and other local stakeholders, it is an opportunity to familiarise themselves with proposals and comment on them so that developers can consider their feedback and make changes ahead of a formal planning application submission to the Council.

The Development Forum is not a decision-making meeting. Its purpose is to raise awareness of forthcoming development proposals, answer questions, and highlight any issues that may need resolving ahead of a planning application submission.

Who can attend?

Everyone is welcome and it is important that we hear from a range of people. No prior knowledge of Planning or involvement in anything like this before is necessary.
